YOH Foundation Supports Cut-a-thon To Inspire Youth

The Youth of Honor Foundation sponsored the back-to-school 2007 CUT-A-THON at The Cutting Method Barber Shop in Marietta, Georgia. Haircuts were only \$5.00 per person for a 24-hour period beginning at 6:00 a.m. on Saturday, August 11th and ending at 6:00 a.m. on Sunday, August 12th.

Over 500 youth and adults (men and women) received discounted haircuts during this cut-a-thon period and many of them were even treated to an extra bonus that they were not expecting.

As part of the activities for this event, H. Ron Brashear, YOH President & founder, was the keynote speaker and addressed the youth and parents in attendance on the importance of the "IT" factor. "I" is for your Image and "T" is for your Talent. "If I can't get past your image I may not be able to embrace your talents," said Ron.

Mr. Brashear spoke to the young males about the ramifications and the adverse stereo types that come along with young males promoting the dress code that is known as "SAGGIN" (this is where their pants are worn below the waistline). Mr. Brashear stated, "It's not my place to tell you how to wear your clothes, and I understand that it is a FAD for you youngsters at this time. However, I would be negligent if I do not point out to you that the image carries a very NEGATIVE stereo-type to it. Therefore just be aware of how you may be treated from others who see you in this dress attire. I, personally, would

much rather see you dress like a PROSPECT than to see you dress like a SUSPECT."

Mr. Brashear also spoke to the parents and the young ladies in attendance about their dress attire as well. He utilized the analogy of ('Putting on too much honey'). He stated, "There is nothing wrong with you wanting to look beautiful. God made you to be beautiful. The key is that you want to make sure you are not putting on too



much honey. You want to put on just enough honey to attract a special bee - a bee that will respect you, cherish, and honor you. If you put on too much honey (low cut tight jeans, skirt too high, etc.) you will attract a swarm of bees. Whenever there is a swarm of bees, there is always the possibility of one of the bees wanting to act out and show its dominance by trying to sting you (verbally or physically)". Based on the reactions from the crowd and the applauses, Mr. Brashear's message was well received and it stimulated quite a bit of dialogue in the barber shop.

Afterwards, we spoke to the owner of Cutting Method Barber Shop, Mr. Nate Evans and he offered the following:

Q: What was your goal when you decided to host the cut-a-thon?

A: "My goal was to provide an opportunity for parents to receive a benefit on the price of a haircut for their kids in preparation for going back to school."

Q: What do you hope that the youth will take away from the experience and the efforts of having themselves well-groomed?

A: "I hope their take-away is that the way you feel will be predicated on the way you look. If you feel good about the way you look, you are going to feel good about everything you do."

Portions of the proceeds from the cut-a-thon benefited the Sheltering Arms Child Care Center, which aids low income families with scholarships to provide daycare assistance. The YOH team is very delighted to have been a part of this event and we wish the Cutting Method Barber Shop in Marietta, Georgia much continued success. 



To Whom It May Concern:

I am an employee of the Macon Youth Development Campus. I have had the pleasure of teaching Family and Consumer Science for over eighteen years at this location. During those years, I have had the opportunity to meet many professionals and see many projects make efforts to improve or rehabilitate the incarcerated youth on this campus. Some projects failed, some worked awhile and fell by the wayside, and others succeeded to some extent.

One day our teaching staff was called together and informed that a man would be coming to work with groups of girls to explain what his life has been like and to show similarities that our girls could identify with. His nameRon Brashear. His book.....Bouncing Back...Living Life the Right Way. As I heard the explanation of his topic and plan, I thought...here we go again—probably another waste of state monies!

Well, boy was I wrong! To me, this man's story and means of presentation are unbelievable. Ron Brashear is such a personable man with such a story to tell! Mr. Brashear has been through so much in his life! This is a person our girls could definitely identify with. He stresses to the girls that they have made mistakes in their behavior, but they can grow through them, instead of just going through them. He says their incarceration can be a bend in the road. It is not the end of the road.

In his program, the girls are given an autographed copy of his book and a workbook with open-ended question for the girls to complete concerning their own experiences. Mr. Brashear exposes the "demons" of his life which encourages the girls through discussions and writings to expose their own demons. He discusses so many valuable topics that the girls understand. The "it" factor, making quick money, who you choose as friends, "haters", wearing too much "honey", hip-hop lyrics and their degradation of women, looking at their windshield and only glancing in their rear-view mirror, importance of education, growing through things, and putting change in the soda machine and their expectations of what they will get.

In the discussions, I take pictures of the girls as they listen, watch, laugh, cry, discuss and identify with his story. I then glue the photos in their book around the section in which they will write their own story of their life.


In summary, I want to say this has been the most meaningful and positive project that the girls at the Macon Y.D.C. have been exposed to in my 18 years on the campus. In the discussion groups, I've seen tears, laughter, "oh, that happened to me too" moments, compassion, deep concern, and respect exchanged. Working with Mr. Brashear has been such a pleasure for me. He is also the nephew of Carl Brashear who was in the movie Men of Honor. You can see that determination for great accomplishments runs in his family! I will always value what I have learned from working with him and the girls. I know he and his book, program, empathy and love have touched and helped many girls here.

The Youth of Honor team decided to spend this past Memorial Day Weekend visiting many of the wounded in an effort to recognize them for their dedicated service to our country. We went to inspire the troops but instead, we walked away with a deeper respect for those defending our freedom and spending months at a time away from their loved ones.

While visiting Walter Reed Hospital the team was given a tour of the Family Assistance Center which is in place to support the family members of recovering soldiers. These family members drop everything and re-locate themselves close the hospital to assist their loved ones in their recovery from the traumas of war. Jobs are left, as well as other family members who remain at home to care for the house and try to keep things running. There is enormous stress on the families, and the Family Assistance Center serves a vital role in supporting their needs.
